8.3.5 DEAD SEA SCROLLS AND RELATED TEXTS

Certain conventions are used to cite texts from Qumran and the surrounding area. The name of the site is given, abbreviated according to the list below.

<i>Q</i>	Qumran

The different caves at each site are denoted with sequential numbers, for example, 1Q, 2Q, etc. Different copies of the same composition from the same cave are indicated by the use of raised lowercase letters, e.g., 1QIsa^a, 1QIsa^b.

8.3.5 Dead Sea Scrolls and Related Texts

There is considerable diversity in nomenclature in actual use for individual documents. In most cases, it is helpful to give the number of the document to avoid confusion. In addition to the number, the descriptive name should be given in the initial citation to permit ease of identification. The number of the text should not be put in italics or bold type, e.g., 4Q520, Mur16.

The first seven scrolls removed from Cave 1, as well as the Cairo Genizah copy of the *Damascus Document*, are referred to customarily by name (not by number). The standard names and abbreviations are as follows:

When a manuscript is referred to by column and line number, roman numerals are used for the column number, followed by a space, with the line number set as arabic numerals (e.g., 1QS III, 12; 1QpHab I, 2). Manuscripts of biblical texts can include the biblical citation of chapter and verse in parentheses: 4QpaleoExod^m V, 4 (9:7).

When there are several fragments and they are numbered separately within a work, the fragments should be in arabic numerals. Thus, 1Q27 1 II, 25 means text 27 from Qumran Cave 1, fragment 1, column II, line 25; 4QpIsa^c 4–7 II, 2–4 means the third copy (copy c) of a pesher on Isaiah from Qumran Cave 4, joined fragments 4 to 7, column II, lines 2 to 4. Fragments are also identified by uppercase letters (e.g., 11Q1 A [Lev 4:24–26]). (While some works use lowercase column numbers, with and without the comma [e.g., 1Q27 1 ii, 25 or 1Q27 1 ii 25], the above conventions are recommended for the sake of simplicity.)

8.3.8 MISHNAH, TALMUD, AND RELATED LITERATURE

Abbreviations distinguish the versions of the Talmudic tractates: *y.* for Jerusalem and *b.* for Babylonian. A prefixed *t.* denotes the tractates of the Tosefta and an *m.* those of the Mishnah. Greek and Latin Works and Their Abbreviations

EXPLANATORY NOTES REGARDING THE TABLE (see also §8.3.14)

- (1) For Greek works as for Latin works, a Latin title and abbreviation are normally used; but if the work is well known under its Greek name, this may be provided in parentheses following the Latin title. In a few cases where scholars almost always use a Greek title instead, we give a Greek abbreviation and a Greek title, both transliterated. We do not use Greek abbreviations in Greek characters.
- (2) For many better-known works, English as well as Latin titles are given. For Greek and Latin classical and patristic works, however, we prefer to use Latin abbreviations in notes even if English titles are used in the text of the book. If English abbreviations are used, the author should provide a list of these.
- (3) Anonymous works in this table are alphabetized by their abbreviations, which are given in bold italics to distinguish them from works of the preceding author. Naturally, when such an abbreviation is used it should be set italic but not bold.
- (4) Abbreviations of spurious works are bracketed.
- (5) For the sake of completeness, some titles are included that are short enough that they need no abbreviation.
- (6) The table is very selective in its choice of authors; but for authors that are included we have tried to offer complete lists of their works.
